This also means Nancy and I are on the cusp of our next transition. I have loved serving as the Church Liaison for the past six years, but it is time for me to step back into a secondary role. I am ready for whatever role he has in store for me.

First Christian Church Princeton, West Virginia

After a time of prayer and discernment, the congregation of First Christian Church in Princeton, West Virginia voted unanimously on Sunday, September 14, 2025 to become an official DHF church. The church had withdrawn from the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) over a year



ago. They wanted to take some time and discern what the next steps should be for their church family. In the end, they decided connecting with DHF was the way to go. The church was founded in 1907 and has faithfully served the Lord and the Princeton community for more than 100 years. The current sanctuary was dedicated in 1951. The Lord opened a door for the church to develop a unique partnership with Mupumbu, Zimbabwe. They built a building with a seating capacity of 200 for an African church that is using it to reach out to the neighboring villages. Arthur Christian Church Bell Arthur, North Carolina

On Sunday, September 14, 2025, the congregation of Arthur Christian Church, Bell Arthur, North Carolina voted unanimously to become a DHF church. Their path to this decision was a little different. They have been an independent congregation for several years after leaving the Disciples of Christ. However, at the encouragement of church leadership, the congregation voted to become part of a network of like-



minded churches in DHF. Arthur Christian Church was founded in 1907. The church pulls a trailer out into the community and serves free coffee and donuts while offering to pray for those who receive the snacks. The church is in a season of growth — both spiritually and physically — as they will be breaking ground on a 17,000 square foot edition in early November. The church is served by Pastor DJ Maxey who is approaching his first anniversary with the church. Pray for Pastor DJ & Dee Dee and Arthur Christian Church as they seek the Lord and continue to serve him in their community.

After the death of our pastor, we searched for an interim, but the denomination didn't have anyone to offer so they sent Sunday morning pulpit supply. But our deeper dissatisfaction was that we didn't feel that the Disciples represented our church, our biblical beliefs, or what Christ taught.

One of our Elders heard about Disciple Heritage Fellowship. To learn more, six of our elders attended a meeting in Decatur, IL. We were anxious but were given the warmest greetings we could have received. We heard the Bible being read and messages being spoken, and we immediately knew we were among fellow believers who were hungry to hear the Bible come alive

We've attended the DHF conference every year since. Our friendships have grown as does the worship experience. Our faith has deepened, and our commitment to the Lord has strengthened as we return to our church family.

The conference is just a small part of what Disciple Heritage Fellowship has to offer, as we were shown recently when everything we thought was going so well our church fell apart. Where do we turn?

That was the question we faced in May 2025. Due to unforeseen circumstances, our beloved pastor concluded he could no longer continue as our pastor. The confusion, hurt, and damage done to our church, our new childcare center, and to members of the congregation was beyond belief.

We turned to our friends in DHF for their guidance, care, and prayers, and we were met with grace and understanding. In the many conversations held with Dr. Rick Grace and Dr. Ellen Moma, the prayers and encouragements were felt deeply. Through their care, help, and guidance, the Lord took us to a better place.

Ellen filled our pulpit and led a question-and-answer session with the Elders and the congregation. Her presence encouraged us and helped us see we could move past this event. We knew DHF would continue to help in any way it could. Pastor Steven Sorensen was enlisted to fill our pulpit for 7 weeks. Pastor David Upchurch, a friend through our association with DHF, spent a weekend with our church leadership team and preached Sunday. Pastor Mike Doak is now our full-time intentional interim.

All this came together due to the family we have in DHF. If you wonder what DHF does for churches that have joined this fellowship, we can tell you they are invaluable! The friendships made at the yearly conferences have now turned into a stream of prayers. Their encouragement will be forever remembered.
