They devoted themselves to prayer (v. 42). An addition for DHF '23 will be a dedicated prayer room. It will be available during the conference if you need to step away from things and spend time with the Lord. At times, there will be people in the prayer room who will either pray for you or with you, depending on your desire. We want to be a people of prayer, and this is step in making that a reality.

They devoted themselves *to praise* (v. 47). We will be led in worship throughout DHF '23 by the Decatur First Christian Worship Arts team. They will help give voice to the worship of God that naturally arises when God's people come together to learn about and celebrate Jesus. As one of our "senior saints" who attended DHF '22 reflected, "I normally don't like praise and worship music, but I couldn't keep from tapping my foot and joining in!"

We are pleased to feature First Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) of Alliance, Ohio, a recent addition to our growing DHF family of churches.

The church was founded in 1857 with 30 charter members. Though four different buildings have housed Alliance FCC, the mission of the church has remained the same – to lift up Jesus in their community. The current building (pictured) was dedicated in 2004, and the newest addition to the church completed in 2012. Pastor Mike Doak has served the church since 2019.

Throughout its history, it has been important to Alliance FCC to be the visible presence of Christ in the community. They serve their community through such things as the Alliance Community food pantry, Michael's World (a children's clothing ministry founded by the church), as well as providing two meals monthly in the downtown area.

The church also participates with Habitat for Humanity in various building projects. For the children of the community, Alliance FCC hosts an annual community Easter egg hunt, and a Halloween ministry where Bible characters in costume

tell Bible stories to the children and their families through a guided prayer walk.

Alliance FCC has recently discovered and connected with DHF. In explaining the decision behind the connection, one of the elders, Mort DeHoff said, "DHF has provided First Christian Church in Alliance an opportunity to reaffirm that we are a congregation that finds great value in the Stone-Campbell traditions. While we are a congregation that has a long history as part of the Disciples of Christ, we are questioning the current directions and decisions of the denominational leadership, many of which we cannot accept."

"Our DHF connection allows us to make a statement that we are a congregation that still believes in the authority of the Bible and that there is salvation only in Jesus. We were encouraged when we found a network of other churches who believe what we believe. We look forward to a long and growing relationship."

Welcome, Alliance First Christian Church, to the DHF network of churches. We look forward to serving our Lord with you for years to come.
